The core curriculum is enhanced by a wide range of extra-curricular opportunities including the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, Ten Tors, and sports and arts clubs.

We are committed to providing an excellent education for all. We do this through rigorous and engaging classes as well as providing a variety of learning experiences outside of the Academy day. We expose our young people to the range of opportunities that life has to offer. We create a nurturing environment that supports the personal development of each young person and ensures that every person is cared for. The pastoral system is in four learning families (houses) each consisting of seven vertically aged tutor groups.
