School Closure Due to Extreme Weather

As you will be aware there was already an amber weather warning for tomorrow which has now been upgraded to red for parts of the region.

Some staff and students will not be able to travel safely and we have been warned of probable disruption to local bus and train services. Therefore, having taken advice from public sector agencies and in discussion with our Chair of Trustees we have decided **to close the school tomorrow, 18 February 2022.**

An amber weather warning – what to expect:

- There is a good chance that flying debris could result in a danger to life
- Damage to buildings and homes is likely, with roofs blown off and power lines brought down
- Roads, bridges and railway lines are likely to close, with delays and cancellations to bus, train, ferry services and flights
- There is a good chance that power cuts, possibly prolonged, could occur, perhaps affecting other services, such as mobile phone coverage
- Large waves are likely and beach material is likely to be thrown onto sea fronts, coastal roads and properties, and flooding of some coastal properties seems likely.
- It is likely there will be falling branches and some uprooted trees

Students should complete work from their Need to Know booklets, Sparx and Tassomai. Year 11 have been given revision for their core subjects, a pack will be posted containing details of revision work to be completed over half term.
